Fire Officer shares his success at Sedgefield Primary

Sedgefield Primary pupils were dazzled by a former pupil, Reece Stewart, as he returned to his primary school classrooms to share his knowledge of the Fire Service.



A team of Fire Officers taught Year 5 and 6 pupils the principles of water safety. Water safety is so important for pupils to be aware of, especially in the summer, when this may play a greater role in their social calendars. The potential dangers of open water need

highlighting further at this time of year. Pupils were also made aware of the risks of walking on ice in winter too, which can appear thick, but may be weakened in places.

Pupils were made aware of cold water shock syndrome and the tragic impact of this to others. We view this type of knowledge as part of our school motto, 'Learning for Life', as this is essential life long learning and increased knowledge could save lives.



Pupils thoroughly enjoyed visiting the fire engine and learning about the different aspects of the vehicle from Reece and the crew. Sedgefield is so lucky to have its own fire station to hand to help support local residents and beyond. We hope the team has encouraged our pupils to consider a future in fire fighting!

The success of many of our Interest Groups this year was aided by the AAP grant we were awarded last year to help with transport costs. We've visited interesting historic houses, walked round beautifully planted and maintained gardens, watched some wonderful theatre, eaten many delicious meals, learned about various scientific, industrial, and technological businesses and sites and, most importantly, spent time with others, met new people and kept busy and active. If you would like to take part in any of these activities you too could join us. Our membership is a very reasonable £25 per year which covers any and all of the above activities (plus several more) and transport costs are only £5 for each trip.

During the June meeting on Road Safety, the Police Officers mentioned an app that they recommend everyone carries on their mobile – What3Words. Each 3 square metres of the world has been given a unique three word coding. If you are ever in a situation when you need to contact Emergency Services the this will enable you to give a precise location. The app will provide the three words which identifies exactly where you

STEVE'S NATURE DIARY AUGUST 2025

As I write this article it has been pretty warm and as a result I have been seeing more butterflies around – definitely more than last year which is good news. The large whites have been hanging around my brassicas with occasional jaunts to lay their tiny yellow eggs. Other garden butterflies seen include Tortoiseshell, Red Admiral, Speckled Wood and more recently Comma. These are generalist butterflies, and they are not too fussy about their habitat requirements and can be found in a number of habitats. I have also been doing a bit of butterfly twitching i.e. going to specific habitats at a particular time of the year where butterflies are active as adults. This has included a trip to Hawnby in late spring for Duke of Burgundy, Bishop Middleham Quarry for Dingy Skipper and Durham Argus and more recently Wingate Quarry for the splendid Marbled White.

The Marbled White is a distinctive, medium-sized, white butterfly, with black-chequered markings. Adults are on the wing in the summer, from June to August. So you still have a chance to see them if you go soon. The adults can often be seen feeding on purple flowers, such as field scabious, common knapweed and wild marjoram. The caterpillars feed on a variety of grasses, but red fescue is especially important.



August is a good time to count butterflies, and the Big Butterfly Count is a nationwide citizen science survey aimed at helping us assess the health of our environment. It was launched in 2010 and has rapidly become the world's biggest survey of butterflies. Over 64,000 citizen scientists took part in 2022, submitting 96,257 counts of butterflies and day-flying moths from across the UK. The Big Butterfly Count 2025 takes place between 18 July and 10 August. It's easy to take part, simply count butterflies for 15 minutes during bright (preferably sunny) weather in any habitat. You can even do it using an app. More information can be found at bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org.

Athletics

Sedgefield will host a major national athletics event for the first time next year. The English Cross Country Association (ECCA) has confirmed that the 2026 English National Cross Country Championships will be held in Hardwick East Park. Organised in partnership with Sedgefield Harriers and supported by Durham County Council, the championships are sponsored by SportsShoes.com and will take place on Saturday 21 February.

A local organising committee will work with ECCA and Durham County Council to deliver the event. Local venues and businesses have already stepped forward to offer support, including Sedgefield Racecourse and Hardwick Hall Hotel. The English National Cross Country Championships attracts thousands of participants and spectators every year and will bring new visitors to the area, and a boost to the hospitality economy.

Former winners of the English National Cross Country Championships include North East athletics legends Brendan Foster and Mike McLeod. One of the great aspects of the event is that anyone who is a member of a club can enter and line up on the start line alongside the elite athletes of the sport as an equal (for a few yards at least!).

Sedgefield Harriers will be hoping to field a big entry of young athletes at the Nationals next February, as the junior section of the club is thriving. The juniors recently held an awards event, celebrating effort, endeavour and great performances over the last year.

Not long before, many of the junior athletes had completed a special 'quadrathlon' event, which involved a sprint (50–100m), howler throw, endurance run (400–800m) and triple jump. 
